

Lost and Damaged Books

If students return damaged books or kits we ask for replacement costs. Most books are damaged by leaking drink bottles so it helps to put books in a plastic bag.

Generally we only ask for replacement costs for lost books once there has been a thorough check of the classroom and we have completed a stock take at the end of the year. We also understand that most books come back!

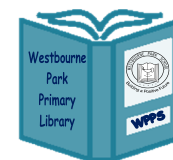

Resource Centre

The Library Resource Centre is managed by the Teacher Librarian (Jo Marshall) with the assistance of a School Services Officer (Barb Breavington) and parent help.

The Teacher Librarian is actively involved in developing children's learning and information skills, working closely with teachers and R-7 students in a variety of ways.

Working co-operatively with staff, the Teacher Librarian aims to:

- encourage a love of literature
- develop and teach 'Mindful Inquiry Units'
- assist children in locating and using a wide range of resources — from book to electronic formats
- develop children's independent research skills
- integrate digital technologies into learning

The Library Resource Centre is open before and after school for borrowing books and at lunch times for games, reading and studying. We also have ebooks available through the Wheelers ePlatform app for year 3 to 7 students to read on mobile devices.

Parents are invited to visit the library with their children and to assist his/her child in book selections. Parents and preschool children are welcome to become library members. **We really need and welcome parent help.**

We celebrate Book Week each August. The theme in 2018 is

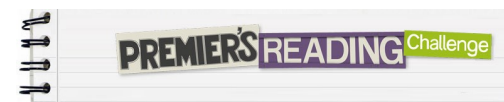
Find Your Treasure.

Helpful Hints

- Try to read with your child every night.
- Encourage them to show what they have borrowed and discuss the book with them.
- Keep the library books in a special area or box at home so they don't get mixed up with other books.
- Encourage your child to be organised with their returning. The more books they return the more they can borrow.
- You can return any weekday, in the mornings, lunch or after school. Books have a loan period of 2 weeks which can be renewed.
- You do not need a library bag to borrow but they do help to keep the books in good condition.
- Overdue notices are emailed every fortnight. We understand that younger students take some time to learn the concepts of borrowing and returning so there may be some errors or problems. Don't worry, come and see us if you have any concerns.
- Books are available for borrowing over school holiday breaks.

We strongly encourage all students at Westbourne Park Primary to do the Premier's Reading Challenge.

Students can participate in this scheme by reading 12 books by early September (8 from an extensive Premier's Challenge list and 4 of their own choice).

The books are available for borrowing in our school library. We have placed some of them in coloured tubs for easy access. The books also have a sticker indicating they are from the PRC list.

As the children read the books they need to have the titles recorded on a form. This can be obtained from your child's teacher or the library. Children also need to put in the author's name and have each one signed off by a parent, teacher or librarian.

Students who successfully manage to read 12 books receive a certificate from the Premier for the first year they complete it and medals in the following years.
