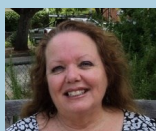

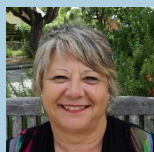

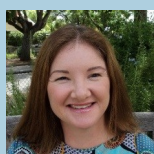

eBooks and ePlatform

Year 3 to 7 students are able to borrow eBooks and audiobooks through the ePlatform app on any tablet device.

We now have over 2000 books and audiobooks available for students of Westbourne Park Primary.

There are some excellent up to date titles available. They are mainly fiction novels. This is free to Westbourne Park Primary students and is provided through our Library.

Here are some instructions in case your child needs help with this:

1. Download and open the ePlatform app. Find Your Library – Westbourne Park Primary school.
2. Sign in - In order for students to borrow and read eBooks they need to enter a username and pin.

The username is in the format:

first name.surname = jo.marshall

Students can find out their 4 digit pin from their teacher or the library.

3. Once they have signed in they are able to borrow 2 books for 2 weeks. Books will automatically be returned after 2 weeks.

If the image of the book looks pale then it is currently being borrowed but students can still reserve the book.

Students can read their books anywhere once it has been downloaded. You will just need an internet connection to download it.

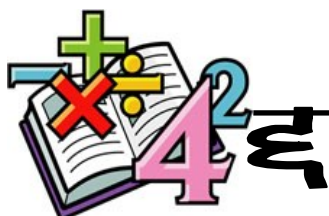

Mathematical Mindset Support

WPPS is seeking interest for a parent information evening about '*Mathematics Education Today*'. We know from our parent survey that a large number of our community did not have great experiences with maths at school, and we also know that some of our students have mathematical anxiety. As educators we know that how we were taught and what is expected today is quite different!

If you would be interested in attending an evening of mathematical fun with Sarah C, please let the front office know. If there is enough interest we will try and run the session early in term 4.

Value Place -Value

Learning mathematics is a challenging task that takes time and experience to learn. Place-Value is the most important aspect of mathematics that we need to learn and understand. Understanding how numbers work and how they can connect to each other is more than 70% of all the maths that we will learn at school.

Place-value can often be confused with counting. Counting is such a small component of understanding place-value. It's about understanding what each digit means when it sits in a certain place eg: 174. The digit 1 means this number has 1 hundred, the 7 means this number contains 7 tens and the 4 means it has 4 ones. When we put that together it is *one hundred and seventy-four*.

However place-value is so much more than that. It is about understanding how numbers work together with all the operations. Understanding that if we multiply a number that we are doing repeated addition. Knowing that subtraction is an inverse operation to addition. There is much more to place-value than counting!

How well do you understand place-value? Can you write the number 174, using place-value, and write it in 10 different ways? This is what we would expect our students to be able to do. The ability to deconstruct numbers in such a way is necessary for students to demonstrate their reasoning and understanding.

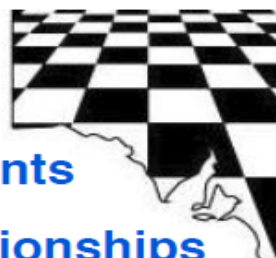

The SAJCL is offering juniors the choice of 3(!) tournaments these holidays - **The October 60 Tournament** is for older juniors and is played at a time rate of 60 minutes +10 secs per move (only 5 rounds - 2 on Thursday and 3 on Friday) or the **October 25 Tournament** where the games are shorter - only 25 minutes each + 10 secs per move (9 games, 4 on Thursday, 5 on Friday). The **State Under 11 - 8 Championships** will all be played at 25 minutes + 10 sec/move.

The players' ages are those on the **1st July 2018**. If they are 8 or younger on 1st of July, they should play in the Under 9; if they are 9, they should play in the Under 10 and if they are 10, they should play in the Under 11 State Championships. Players who are 11 or older should play in either the October 60 minute +10 spm tournament starting or the October 25 minute +10 spm event.

The Chess Centre will be open from 8.30am on all days to allow parents to drop off youngsters before work. The sessions will all be finished by 3.30 pm, except the October 60 on the Friday may go to 4.15pm.

4 games on Thursday, 5 games on Friday:

Thursday: 10am, 11.15am, 1pm & 2pm; Friday: 9.30am, 10.30am, 11.30am, 1pm & 2pm.

The **October 60 Tournament times will be:** Thursday 10am and 1pm and Friday 9am, 11.30am and 1.45pm.

Special one-day tournaments will be organised for those who can play for just one day.
