

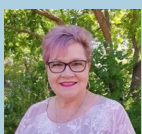

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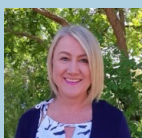

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## Bike Ed

This term the year 5 students have been participating in the Way to Go Bike Ed program. This Program promotes safer, greener and more active travel and is endorsed by Bike SA, the RAA and the South Australian Department of Planning, Transport and Infrastructure.

The students received free lessons, which included a bike roadworthiness check by the RAA. They have learnt about road rules, safety and cycling skills. The lessons have been strengthening the students' awareness and confidence when cycling on the road, using the correct hand signals and understanding road signs. The final lessons saw the students venture out on to local roads.

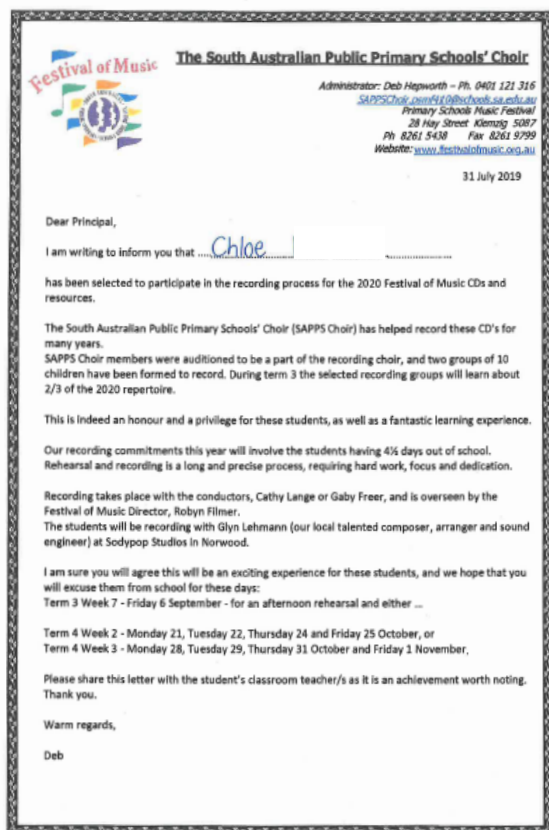
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## Student Achievements

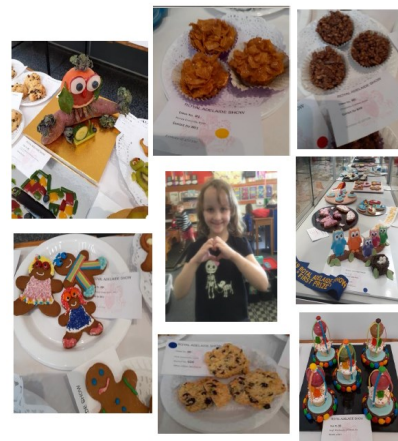
